Enzo Enea, the founder and principal owner of Enea Landscape Design in Rapperswil-Jona, Switzerland, will join Chad Oppenheim during his lecture at Harvard University to share his thoughts on the notion of paradise and how it can be expressed through landscape design. By giving an introduction to his company, their design and work philosophy, and showing examples of their projects, he will give his impressions on how paradise can be executed. Integral to his ideas of a successful landscape are the stages of critical spatial and program analysis (or, deconstruction) and, as a design/build firm, the final stage of implementation (construction).
